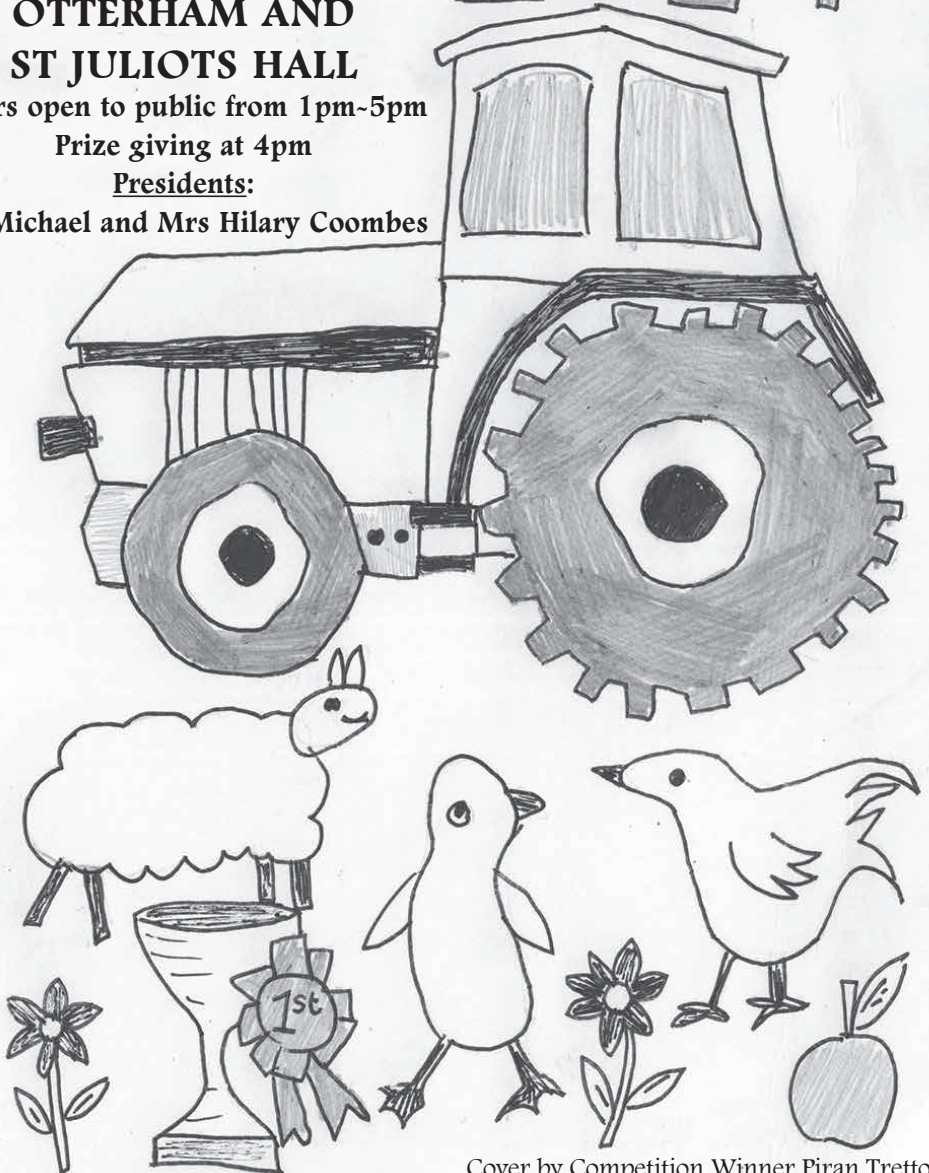

HORTICULTURE & HANDICRAFT RULES FOR EXHIBITORS

- All exhibitors must fill in the appropriate form, stating clearly the classes in which they wish to compete In with age stated for children classes
- ONE ENTRY PER CLASS PER EXHIBITOR
- **Vegetable and flowers classes may have up to 2 entries per exhibitor**
- ALL ENTRY FORMS RETURNED BY **Saturday 10th August**

- **The competition area will be open for exhibitors to stage from 7pm till 9pm The night before the show and from 7am-8:30am on the day of the show,** items staged before this time will be at exhibitors' own risk.
- **All exhibitors must have staged their entry and have left the exhibition area by 8:40am on show day.**
- Class cards corresponding to the entry must be displayed by the exhibit. - Exhibits not having an appropriate card will not be judged.
- **All vegetables and flowers must have been grown by the exhibitors.**
- **All cookery items must have been home made by the exhibitor.**
- **Failure to comply with these RULES will disqualify exhibitors**
- **Judging will commence at 9am** - The tent will then be closed for judging.
- The competition area will be open to the general public at **1pm approx. or before if we can!!**
- **No items** to be removed from the exhibition area until **16:30pm approx.**
- **Cup winners need to be in the horticulture & handicraft Marquee by 2pm for prize giving by the 2024 vice presidents** - Mr and Mrs David and Pam Langley
- The cup winners will be asked to sign for the cup and please return them by 1st July 2025
- **Points will be awarded** on the following basis.
1st ~ 5 points 2nd ~ 3 points 3rd ~ 1 point

FLORAL ART

All exhibits must be the work of the exhibitor, exhibits may be staged the evening before the show at exhibitors' own risk, to be arranged with the section secretary.

Recipe for class 38 Apple Coconut cake

| | |
|---|-------------------------|
| 6oz butter or margarine | 6oz golden caster sugar |
| 8oz self-raising flour, sifted | 1tsp baking powder |
| 1tsp vanilla extract | ½tsp ground cinnamon |
| 2 large apples, peeled and cut into small cubes | 3 eggs |
| 2oz desiccated coconut plus extra for top | Sugar glaze |

Method: Pre-heat the oven to 180° C. Grease and line a round 8 inch springform cake tin with nonstick baking paper.

In a large mixing bowl, cream together the fat, sugar and vanilla extract until light and fluffy. Beat in the eggs. Fold in the flour, baking powder and cinnamon until incorporated, then add the chunks of apple and 75g of desiccated coconut, mixing well.

Spoon into the prepared cake tin, and level off with the back of a wet tablespoon. Bake for 60-70 mins until a cake tester comes out clean when inserted into the centre. Remove from the oven and allow to cool in the tin for 10 minutes before turning out to cool completely on a wire rack.

Brush the top of the cake with a stiff sugar glaze and pat desiccated coconut all over until covered.
